

Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Looking back on 2025, I am struck by the many ways our neighbors turned to us for support, amidst increasing challenges and concerns. Immanuel Community Services (ICS) met these growing community needs with compassion and care, a reminder of why our work matters every day. As many neighbors faced housing instability, food insecurity and uncertainty around immigration enforcement, ICS remained a safe place where people are welcomed with dignity.

This year, we focused on ways to make all our services more accessible and safer for the people we serve. We repaired floors and purchased a wheelchair ramp to meet the needs of guests with physical mobility issues. We brought community partners in to bring supportive services directly to our community here at ICS: DSHS Mobile Van to assist with benefits, Department of Licensing to replace IDs, the Dental Van, Public Health providing vaccinations & help enrolling in health insurance and more.

2025 also brought heightened immigration actions that deeply affected many in our community. ICS remains committed to protecting the dignity, privacy and safety of every person who walks through our doors. Alongside our partners at Immanuel Lutheran Church, we continue to be a welcoming and trusted place for all. We are continuing to review our programs and spaces to ensure our guests have safe and equitable access to services.

On a sad note, we mourned the loss of Patty Turnberg, who served as Executive Director from 2009 to 2016. Patty's legacy of joy and hope lives on in every single person served at ICS. She is deeply missed.

None of this work would be possible without our volunteers, donors, partners and community. Your generosity fuels every meal, every shower, every night of shelter and every moment of connection. Thank you for standing with us and helping build a community of dignity and hope, where everyone is seen and valued.

ICS Recovery Shelter

The ICS Recovery Shelter provides a safe, supportive, and substance-free environment for men working to overcome addiction. Up to 15 residents stay with us while actively participating in Intensive Outpatient Treatment at the Matt Talbot Center.

At ICS, we offer more than just a place to sleep—we provide nourishing meals, a stable home, and the resources needed to focus on recovery. Through life skills training and a structured, supportive community, we help residents build a strong foundation for lasting independence.

Dave's Day Center at ICS

Dave's Day Center at ICS (Hygiene Center) is open weekdays from 8am-2pm to anyone experiencing homelessness. We provide a welcoming environment to those who need a safe place to wash clothes, take a shower, enjoy two hot meals and find a few hours of respite from the outdoors.

Guests receive a hot lunch, toiletries, razors, shampoo, deodorant, soap, clothes, blankets and survival supplies like socks, rain coats & hand-warmers. These critical survival services allow people the opportunity to work on housing and other daily activities with dignity.

SLU Food Bank at ICS

The SLU Food Bank at ICS provides healthy and nutritious food to anyone in need, regardless of their location or financial circumstances.


Many of our shoppers are on fixed incomes. Although many receive SNAP benefits, these funds often fall short of ensuring sufficient nutrition throughout the month.

ICS Community Lunch

A team of volunteers prepares a warm nutritious meal for anyone who would like to enjoy a hot meal and friendly conversation on the last Sunday of every month. For those that are hungry, it is a welcome hot meal. For those that are isolated & live alone, it provides community and conversation with neighbors.








